OUR DISCIPLE-MAKING PROCESS AND STRUCTURE

It all begins with a person having a living, loving and compassionate relationship with Jesus Christ that results in equipping other believers in Christ. This is an Intentional Process which uses multiple approaches through Biblical communities, such as worship services, shepherd groups and other type of small groups and one on one mentoring. The focus of these groups is to glorify Christ by making disciples who glorify Christ by spending time with God in prayer and His word, time with others and time in missions & ministry.

This process will prepare and move us to become Christ-like to the Glory of God as we:

- Fulfill Christ's Great Commandment (**Matthew 22:37-40**)
- Fulfill Christ's Great Commission (**Matthew 28:19-20**)

If we seek a wholehearted love relationship with God as Jesus did, the outcome will be a life in which we:

- 1. Believe what Jesus believed (transformed mind)**
- 2. Live as Jesus lived (transformed character)**
- 3. Love as Jesus loved (transformed relationships)**
- 4. Minister as Jesus ministered (transformed service)**
- 5. Lead as Jesus led (transformed influence)**

OUR ROLES AS A CHURCH BODY IN DISCIPLE MAKING

The fulfillment of the roles listed below, from the Pastor to the first-time church member, comes out of a continual surrendering to Christ by walking in a daily relationship with God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. As you fulfill your role you will begin to glorify Christ by taking on His likeness:

Senior Pastor's role and commitment is to live and model an authentic Christian life of godliness:

- ⇒ His primary task is to teach and preach the Word of God **(2 Tim. 4:1-2)**
- ⇒ Cast the vision of disciple-making before all the people **(Matthew 28:18-20)**
- ⇒ Graciously expose and refute error **(1 Timothy 1:3-5, 5:1-2)**
- ⇒ Give direction & training for the church leadership **(1 Peter 5:1-4; Eph. 4:11-16)**
- ⇒ Willingly suffer hardship and persecution in service for the Lord **(2 Tim 1:8, 2:3-13, 4:5)**
- ⇒ Participate in and model the life of a reproducing Disciple to bring encouragement and accountability within the body of Christ at FBCM **(2 Tim. 2:2, 1 Tim. 4:12)**

Other Ministerial staff members role is similar to that of the Senior Pastor but in that staff member's area of ministry:

- ⇒ Participate in and model the life of a reproducing Disciple to bring encouragement and accountability within the body of Christ at FBCM **(2 Tim. 2:2, 1 Tim. 4:12)**

- ⇒ Carry out and promote the teachings of Jesus and His vision for us to make disciples among the nations **(Matthew 28:18-20)**
- ⇒ Willingly suffer hardship and persecution in service for the Lord **(2 Tim.1:8, 2:3-13, 4:5)**
- ⇒ Model discipleship by reproducing disciples through participation in communities that provide encouragement, accountability and one-on-one mentoring **(2 Tim. 2:2; Galatians 6:1-2; Matthew 25:34-40; James 5:14-15)**

Church Member's role and responsibility:

- ⇒ Become a loving, compassionate obedient follower of Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit **(Luke 9:23, Acts 1:8; 2 Timothy 2:15, Matthew 28:18-20,)**
- ⇒ Be trained to use his/her gifts through the power of the Holy Spirit to directly minister to God, believers and non-believers **(2 Cor. 8:5, Col. 3:23-24, Heb. 6:10, Mat. 5:13)**
- ⇒ Seek to win those to Christ who do not know Him **(Acts 20:24, Luke 19:10)**
- ⇒ Become a personal Disciple maker while participating in a Shepherd group community **(Matthew 28:19; 2 Timothy 2:2)**

OUR DISCIPLE-MAKING METHODS & RESOURCES

FBC Matthews process to make Disciples of Christ is through the following Biblical communities: Worship Services, Shepherd Groups, other small groups of 3 to 9 people (men's, women's or couples) and 1 on 1 (man to man or woman to woman only):

Our Disciple-making methods will embrace God's view of Biblical community:

I. God lives in, embraces and seeks after Biblical Community

- With Adam (**Genesis 1:26**)
- People of Israel (**Deuteronomy 6:4**)
- The Godhead (**John 1:1-3**)

II. Jesus and the Disciples modeled Biblical Community

- Christ came to provide community and to live with us (**Matthew 1:23**)
- He called a small group of disciples to live & walk with Him (**Mark 3:7-10**)
- Jesus chose to invest His life in twelve and a core group of three by walking and training them, resulting in many others being reached (**Mark 3:13-14**)

III. Jesus prayed for Community and Unity for His Disciples

- He prayed for us to be one, as He and the Father and the Holy Spirit are one. (**John 17:11**)
- He also prayed that we would be unified through His truth (**John 17:17**)
- Christ sees our community and unity as our message to the world that He is love (**John 17:21,23**)

Our Disciple-making Group Leaders (Shepherd Group leaders, other small group leaders, one on one mentors) will be trained with the Bible and the curriculum listed below:

Our selected Disciple-making groups, curriculum & resources will be Biblically centered and embrace the following essential elements:

I. Love

- Our vertical relationship with God and our horizontal relationship with others (**Matthew 22:37-40**)

II. Christ-likeness and Conformity

- Teach all that Jesus commanded us (**Matthew 28:19,20**)
- A genuine desire to be conformed into His character, (**Genesis 1:26, Romans.8:29**) grace and humility (**Matthew 11:29**)

III. Devotion to the Church

- A desire to be a healthy body of believers by being committed to the foundations of the church such as the Word of God, fellowship, prayer and Doctrine (**Acts 2:42**)

IV. Equipping of the Saints

- In Life, Leadership, Witness, Prayer, Apologetics, Ministry and Missions (**Ephesians 4:11-16**)
